



## **Clinical Professor of Art Art Gallery Director and Curator**

The Art Department of Dyson College of Arts and Sciences of Pace University invites applications for an anticipated faculty position at the Clinical Professor level (non-tenure track) to begin January 2019. The successful applicant will also serve as Director and Curator of a new University art gallery that is street level. The Department offers a BFA in Art, and a BA in both Art and Art History. Concentrations are offered in Photography, Sculpture and 3D Design, Digital and Time-based Arts, Graphic Design, and Painting and Drawing. The position is located at the University's New York City campus in lower Manhattan.

Applicants should have an appropriate terminal degree, such as MFA or PhD in curatorial studies, arts administration, fine art, history of art, museum studies, or equivalent and a demonstrated professional record of managing all aspects of gallery exhibitions (experience in an academic setting preferred), and prior teaching experience at the undergraduate level. A comprehensive and demonstrated knowledge of contemporary art and theory is preferable.

The successful candidate will work with the Art Department's Public Programming Committee to shape the new gallery's artistic direction, producing exhibitions and related educational programming, and will be responsible for planning and implementing all aspects of exhibitions, including curating, budgeting, shipping and handling, registration, installation, insurance, fundraising, supervision of student aides and one part-time staff member, and publicity. This position will involve working with the University Development office, managing installation staff and student workers, public outreach and advertising offices, as well as outside organizations who may be partnering with programming for the gallery. Additionally, the successful candidate will be required to teach two undergraduate courses in the Art Department per academic year.

Applicants should submit in a single PDF file, a cover letter, CV, a statement describing teaching philosophy, examples of creative work, such as images or exhibition catalogues (with maximum size of 20MB with links embedded in the PDF as appropriate, and indicating applicants role in the exhibition), and list of three professional references, to [artsearch@pace.edu](mailto:artsearch@pace.edu). Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Applications received by November 15, 2018 will receive full consideration.
