Abstract

New Rochelle, New York allows certain small-scale, roof-mounted systems as accessory uses under the City's general accessory use definition. Solar energy collectors on one- or two-family dwellings, as well as those that cover less than 1,000 square feet of the roof area of other buildings, require only a building permit.

Chapter 331. Zoning Article IV. General District Regulations § 331-25. Solar energy collectors.

- A. Installation of solar energy collectors, other than for one- and two-family dwellings, which collectors shall cover 1,000 square feet or more, individually or in aggregate, of the roof area of a building, shall be subject to approval by the Planning Board, in accordance with the provisions and procedures of Article XIII, Site Plan Approval, which shall take into account the needs of energy conservation. [Amended 12-11-2007 by Ord. No. 294-2007]
- B. Access to sunlight for present and potential solar energy systems, both on- and off-site, as well as building siting, orientation and landscaping, shall be considered by all approving agencies as part of their review of any application.
- C. New construction on any lot which would block access to sunlight, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time for existing approved solar energy collectors or for solar energy collectors for which a permit has been issued is prohibited except by permission from the Board of Appeals on a showing that other arrangements are infeasible or impractical, or that the degree of blocking is negligible.
